

## Senate Charter Bill Side by Side Comparison

	SB 6194 (Litzow)	SB 6163 (Billig)
Governance	<ul> <li>Maintains governance structure of the Commission as a statewide authorizer and district authorizers approved by the State Board of Education</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>No statewide authorizer</li> <li>All districts can be authorizers and can only authorize schools within their district boundaries</li> <li>No oversight of district authorizers</li> </ul>
Common Schools	Charter schools are not common schools	<ul> <li>Charter schools are common schools</li> </ul>
Funding	<ul> <li>Charter schools, the Commission, and charter related activities are funded out of the Opportunity Pathways Account (lottery revenue).</li> <li>No access to local levy dollars</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Charter schools are funded out of the general fund in same was as other common, district schools</li> <li>Access to local levy dollars, but no requirement that schools receive district average—amount is agreed upon on charter contract</li> </ul>
Keeps current schools open	Keeps all current schools open	Keeps only the Spokane schools     open
Compliance/ Autonomy	<ul> <li>Must provide a program of basic education</li> <li>Exempt from most state statutes and rules</li> <li>Exempt from district policies</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Must provide basic education, but exempt from hours and days requirements</li> <li>Subject to most state statutes and rules</li> </ul>
Cap on # of schools/ timeline	<ul> <li>Resets 5-year timeline for establishing 40 schools to start when new law passed</li> <li>Current schools don't count towards cap</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Eliminates 5-year timeline and cap on number of schools that can open</li> </ul>
School approval process	<ul> <li>Same application and approval process for schools as previous law</li> <li>Authorizers must give reason for non-approval or non-renewal in writing</li> <li>Schools may apply to state authorizer if not approved by district</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>No appeal process if not approved</li> <li>District not required to give reason for non-approval or non-renewal</li> </ul>
Student enrollment lottery	<ul> <li>Revised to include preference for at-risk students in enrollment</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Same lottery as previous law, only preference for siblings of students currently enrolled</li> </ul>



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Facilities	<ul> <li>Charters can receive state funds for construction, but cannot be from common school construction fund</li> <li>Charters have right of first refusal for unused district buildings at fair market value (not below)</li> <li>Conversion charter schools no longer get to stay in same building rent free</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Charter schools should be included in district facility planning</li> <li>Can use state matching funds for school construction</li> <li>Right of first refusal for unused district buildings at or below fair market value</li> </ul>
Fix for other non-common programs	<ul> <li>Includes other non-common, public school programs:         <ul> <li>National Guard youth challenge program</li> <li>UW Highly Capable program</li> <li>Educational programs for juvenile inmates</li> <li>Education centers</li> <li>Community learning centers</li> <li>Tribal compact schools</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Does not address other programs
