

LEVF School Transformation Partner

League of Education Voters Foundation (LEVF) seeks an experienced, collaborative, flexible School Transformation Partner to assist South Shore School, a Pre-Kindergarten-Grade 8 public school in Southeast Seattle, in becoming a model for academic and social-emotional excellence. The School Transformation Partner will work with educators, students, families and the South Shore community to realize this vision. Cultural competence is required, as is a profound belief that all children can achieve at high levels when properly supported, and that building an outstanding public school is not only possible, but necessary. An annual grant of \$1 million is available for targeted, strategic investment to catalyze change. This is a part-time position estimated at 20-25 hours per week with flexibility for the ideal candidate.

CORE RESPONSBILITIES

Provide strategic and operational support to South Shore leadership and staff focused on delivering an excellent education to students

- Meet regularly with the South Shore School Leadership Team and provide support for mission and vision setting, strategic planning and the development of operational plans.
- Build a school-wide expectation for excellence at South Shore. Work with school leadership, staff and community to foster enthusiasm for realizing this vision.
- Attend school events and build relationships with the school community.
- Oversee implementation of instructional coaching for the leadership team to ensure quality and accountability of the student instructional experience and school program.
- Help develop and refine data analysis and tracking systems and ensure that studentfocused data is collected in a timely manner and used to inform school and student decisions.
- Support the creation of a long-term aligned professional development plan for staff that builds staff skill in both grade- and content- level domains.
- Collaborate with the Principal and Building Leadership Team on budget decisions and support the creation of the school's annual funding and budget.
- Support the Leadership Team in the hiring of mission-aligned staff, especially when vacancies occur during the year.
- Support efforts to diversify the staff, increase the cultural competence of all educators, and demonstrate inclusive and authentic engagement.

Partner with the School District and other Community Partners

- Advocate and communicate with Seattle Public Schools on behalf of the grant and school
- Work with the South Shore team on alignment and implementation of the new district strategic plan
- Build relationships with stakeholders at Seattle Public Schools (Grants, Director of Schools, Curriculum, Assessment, Instruction, etc.)
- Build relationships with partners in the school's portfolio (City Year, Seneca, City of Seattle)
- Plan and lead on all communication and meetings for the LEVF Grant Committee
- Lead contact for the League of Education Voters with the district
- Attend meetings at Seattle Public Schools, League of Education Voters and other partnership organizations in service of the school

Administration and Reporting

- Provide regular updates of school investments to stakeholders (Grant Committee, LEVF Board, School community, district)
- Serve as lead writer and negotiator in grant contract between Seattle Public School and League of Education Voters
- Attend appropriate Seattle Public Schools Board meetings to secure annual Board Action Report approval
- Review proposed annual budget by Principal to ensure that allocations are aligned to the goals of the Seattle Public Schools League of Education Voters Foundation agreement.
- Organize school walkthroughs to ensure that programs are implemented as outlined in grant
- Write quarterly reports on school progress to highlight work and areas of need for the grant committee

QUALIFICATIONS

The ideal candidate is results-driven leader who possesses an unwavering belief that all children are capable of academic achievement putting them on a path to success in college, career, and life.

Required skills and experience:

- Relevant experience in education in an elementary or middle school as a teacher, counselor, or other student-support role; experience in a large urban district preferred but not required.
- Proven ability to build relationships and effectively communicate with people in a variety
 of roles and influence them towards outcomes.
- A track record of taking initiative, setting big goals, and successfully overcoming barriers to success.
- Excellent strategic planning and data analysis skills. Must be adept at tracking progress and presenting data analysis in an easy-to-understand format for presentations and reports.
- Bachelor's Degree

Desired but not required:

- Experience in an educational setting serving students with special needs, e.g. English Language Learners, Special Education or student experiencing trauma practice
- Direct experience managing people.
- Experience working in a school or classroom where students demonstrated significant growth through high-quality instruction and social emotional learning experiences.

COMPENSATION

This part-time position is estimated at 20-25 hours per week during the academic year (late August through mid-June) and is ideal for someone looking for part-time work (i.e., during the school day). Salary negotiable based on experience and availability with a compensation range of \$40-\$55K. Ideal applicant would start as soon as possible with a portion of the work done remotely and a portion on site at the school.
