The Official Voice of Washington Youth Odified into state law in 2005, the Washington State Legislative Youth Advisory Council (UAC) is the formal voice representing Washington youth to the State Legislature. LVAC is comprised of 22+ students, aged 14 to 15 years old, from diverse political, geographical, ethnic, and aocide-commic backgrounds. By Iobbying legislatore, organizing legislative action days at the State Capitol, and criss-crossing the Cascades holding advocacy workshops, LVAC aims to pass arous legislative agend and to inspire other young people to engage with the legislative process

#### What do we do?

Entirely youth-led with oversight from the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, the council develops and advocates for its own legislative agenda each year. To develop their agenda, LYAC members conduct policy research, meet one-on-one with legislators, testify and write blik. They also organize educational workshops throughout the state, including the largest youth legislative event each year at the State Capitol, Youth Action Days.

#### Who supports LYAC?

LYAC is supported by the Office of the Lieutenant Governor. Per state law, each council member is formally appointed by the Lieutenant Governor after an extensive application process led by the council itself.










# You're Invited to LYAC's Action Day 2025!
