

Tukwila School District Profile

- Serve 2,724 scholars daily in three elementary, one middle and one high school.
- The District covers 5.4 square miles bordering Seattle and Highline districts.
- There are approximately 400 employees.
- The Operating budget is \$57.5 million annually (83% staffing related costs).
- We are highly diverse : 23.1 % Asian, 21 % African American, 35.9 % Hispanic or Latino, 0.6 % Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander, 6.2 % Two or more races, 9.5 % White and more than 80 languages are spoken.
- We serve scholars with a variety of needs: 82.7 % Low Income, 56 % Multilingual Learners, 8% Highly Capable, 15 % Homeless, 15 % students with documented and accommodated disabilities.

Foster High School Celebrations

<u>2023-2024</u>:

- 86.8% of our seniors graduated within 4 years; 5.9% continued onto their 5th year.
- Over 72% of students completed FAFSA/WAFSA applications.

<u>2024-2024</u>:

- Out of the 2025 seniors 76% of respondents indicated intentions to attend either a 2-year or 4-year institution after graduation.
- Seniors were awarded over \$5.3 million in scholarships worth in tuition and fees for the next four years.
- 43 students earned the Seal of Biliteracy.
