STATEWIDE CHALLENGES

PRIMARY STATEWIDE CHALLENGE:

Underfunded + inequitable system + siloed systems

SOLUTION:

Advocate for student-centered solutions to create an education system that works for each and every Washington student, family, and educator

2045 Goal: Every Washington student graduates ready for their future: Equipped with the self-confidence and civic knowledge, social-emotional and problem-solving skills, and technological fluency to adapt, thrive, and shape the future.

POWER BUILDING AND CROSS-SYSTEM COORDINATION

70+ organizations engaged and aligned annually across Washington, from grassroots to grasstops

COMMUNITY VOICE, RESEARCH AND LEARNING

- 10,000 people engaged annually to inform policy and advocacy priorities, ensuring community-led change
- 1–2 major research/milestone reports in next four years

EDUCATION AND MOBILIZATION

Multi-partner public awareness and mobilization campaigns grounded in research-based solutions and lived experience

LEGISLATIVE ENGAGEMENT AND POLICY DEVELOPMENT

Introduce strongly supported legislation for more equitable education funding in the 2029 session

▶ SHORT-TERM OUTCOMES

Incremental funding and policy solutions that address immediate and urgent challenges; a stronger Washington ecosystem of education advocates

▶ LONG-TERM OUTCOMES

A funding system that provides students, educators, and communities the resources needed to ensure every student can access a high-quality education

CONTRIBUTING CHALLENGE:

Fragmented/siloed advocacy

SOLUTIONS:

Align + coordinate advocacy organizations and champions

POWER BUILDING AND CROSS-SYSTEM COORDINATION

Power-Building Infrastructure:

- Statewide grassroots cohort (5+ orgs)
- Coalitions disrupting the school-to-prison pipeline, special education, improving school-based mental health, and youth leadership

Cross-System Coordination:

- Spokane Future Educators of Color Consortium
- Cross-system workgroups (Superintendents; OSPI K–12 Funding Equity; Big Idea Group)
- P–20W system alignment to magnify impact + P–20W legislation leadership

LEGISLATIVE ENGAGEMENT AND POLICY DEVELOPMENT

Grow relationships with champions in the legislature across parties and issues who are active, vocal, and well-positioned to drive change

▶ SHORT-TERM OUTCOMES

Faster, aligned, coordinated advocacy action

▶ LONG-TERM OUTCOMES

Aligned P-20W, future-ready pathway informed by all stakeholders is championed across Washington

CONTRIBUTING CHALLENGE:

Policy made without impacted voices

SOLUTIONS:

Center youth/family/community leadership

COMMUNITY VOICE, RESEARCH AND LEARNING

- Annual community-informed policy platform interviews
- Student Potential Youth Advisory Council, Youth Advocacy Summit; Youth Advocacy Hub (youth-authored content); Youth-led/engaged LEVinars
- Spokane Advisory Committee; Yakima/Central WA Advisory Committee

EDUCATION AND MOBILIZATION

Youth Advocacy Summit; Youth Advocacy Hub (bill selection + resources); Youth-led/engaged LEVinars; Family and caregiver advocacy trainings

LEGISLATIVE ENGAGEMENT AND POLICY DEVELOPMENT

Draft and refine policy legislation informed by community voices

▶ SHORT-TERM OUTCOMES

Youth/families gain skills + access; solutions reflect lived experience

▶ LONG-TERM OUTCOMES

Youth and families inform policy and decisions that support and define their future-ready education experience

CONTRIBUTING CHALLENGE:

Narrow measures of success exclude student experience

SOLUTIONS:

Use research, data, lived experience

COMMUNITY VOICE, RESEARCH AND LEARNING

- South Shore PreK–8 programming as test bed for best practices, applied research
- Mental and behavioral health research report with policy recommendations

EDUCATION AND MOBILIZATION

Regional town halls on funding and student supports to gather information and grow advocates (Yakima + Spokane)

LEGISLATIVE ENGAGEMENT AND POLICY DEVELOPMENT

Draft and refine policy legislation informed by community voices

▶ SHORT-TERM OUTCOMES

Better understanding of root causes + promising practice

▶ LONG-TERM OUTCOMES

Student experience informs and helps drive how best to evolve the education system to meet rapidly changing opportunities and needs

CONTRIBUTING CHALLENGE:

Rapid policy shifts + uncertainty

SOLUTIONS:

Policy analysis + rapid response infrastructure

EDUCATION AND MOBILIZATION

- Annual policy platform + coordinated agenda
- Monthly LEVinars
- Weekly legislative roundup during session + action alerts
- Bill tracker + Youth Advocacy Hub policy updates
- Every-other-month federal advocacy calls/briefings (~6/yr)
- 3+ briefs/ budget explainers annually
- 48-hour mobilization capacity in three regions

LEGISLATIVE ENGAGEMENT AND POLICY DEVELOPMENT

Grow relationships with champions + introduce strongly-supported legislation

▶ SHORT-TERM OUTCOMES

Advocates prepared + coordinated in uncertain times

▶ LONG-TERM OUTCOMES

Sustained progress with strong, coordinated champions and informed advocates who are aligned on educational priorities to support youth in becoming future-ready
